

Vaccines for Kids



The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends everyone ages 5 and older should be vaccinated and boosted against COVID-19. A Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine booster is recommended for 5-11 year old children at least 5 months after completing their primary series. (Most children should have a primary series of two doses. However, children who have a moderately to severely weakened immune system will need a primary series of three doses.)

COVID-19 can cause serious illness in children and teens, sometimes resulting in serious short and long-term health problems. Vaccines reduce these risks, as well as reducing the risk of spread to people who may be more vulnerable!

Children and teens who have already had COVID-19 should still get vaccinated!

Emerging evidence indicates that people can get added protection, avoid contracting COVID-19 again, and lessen their chances of developing long COVID-19 by getting vaccinated after having been infected with the virus. So even if a child has had COVID-19, they should still get fully vaccinated.

In order to increase the number of children and teens vaccinated in the community, the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) is providing mobile vaccination clinics statewide.
